TASTING NOTES

- Colour: Deep purple black.
- Aroma: Explosive aromas of ripe currant, red berries and smoked notes.
- Taste: Rich, powerful and voluminous on the attack, a huge mouthful of creme-decassis concentration, silken and juicy in the mid-palate with excellent length and persistence. Fine, ripe tannins, at once supple and structurally present.
- Food: Pair this wine with fried cheese with tomato relish.

AWARDS & ACCOLADES

2022 ~ 93 Points. "It matured in new and second-use French oak barrels for one year, but they were looking for lower toast and less impact of the wood in the wine than earlier vintages when it was 100% new oak. It has a paler color and a subtler and more floral nose, keeping the poise and showing surprisingly fresh for the conditions of the year. It's ripe, reflecting the warm and dry weather, with 15% alcohol but very good freshness, coming through as balanced and harmonious, clean and pure. The 2021 Juan Gil (silver label) feels more harmonious, complex and deep than the 2020, as I noticed in most wines when I tasted both years; it's longer and more elegant, very clean.
